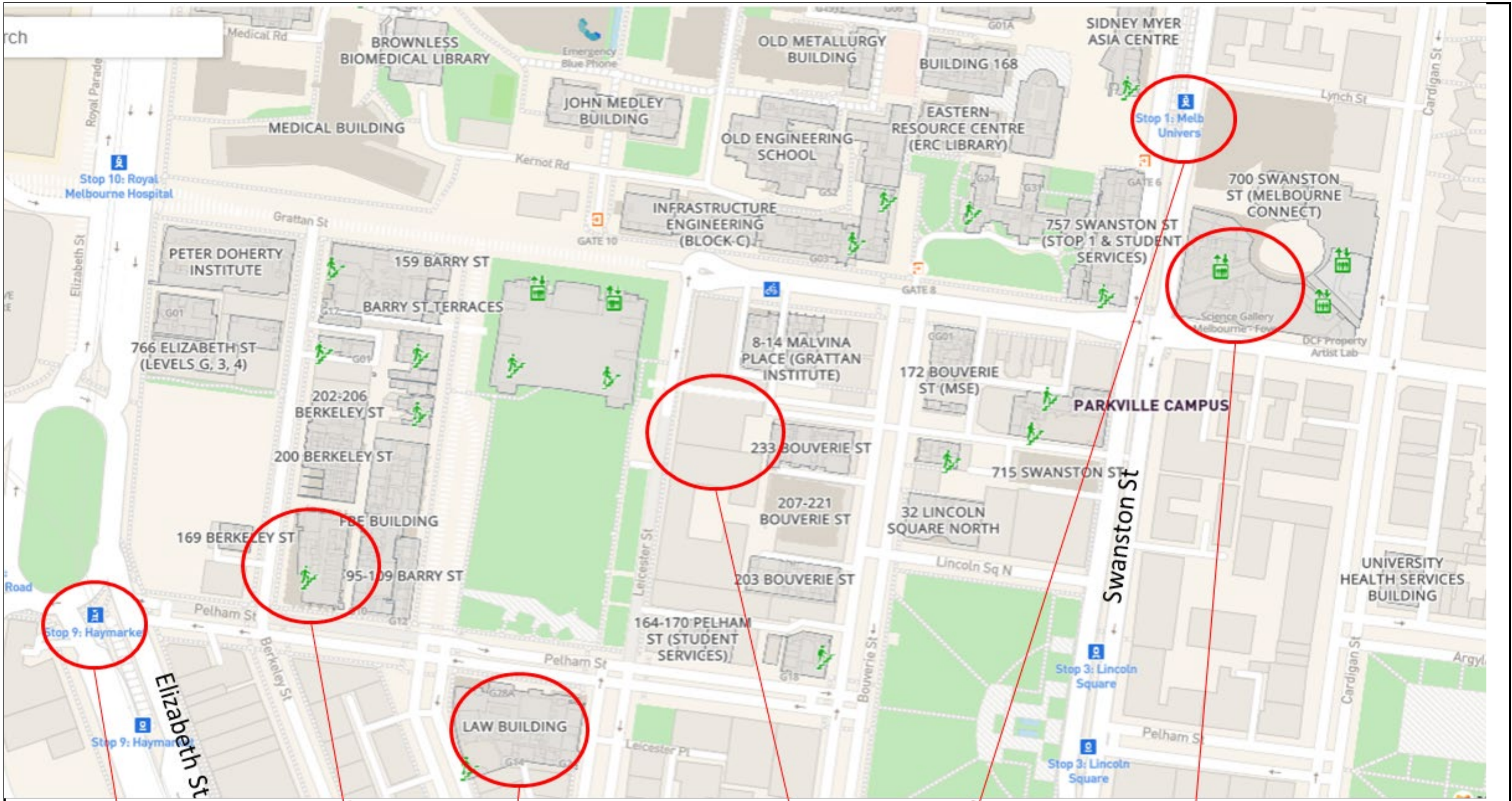

The team will present different designs to embed Indigenization holistically into a mandatory subject for students undertaking IT Degrees at the University of Canberra. With support from educational design specialists, the curriculum of a pilot IT unit was redesigned, based on earlier informal feedback, to integrate Yankaporta's (2009) 8 Ways of Indigenous Learning framework into the content, teaching methods, and assessments. This integration of Indigenisation into the pilot IT unit is being evaluated by both quantitative and qualitative methods with the intention of establishing a design that can be adapted to other IT units. The workshop will present how a Design Science Research methodology is used to informally appraise the previous pilot IT unit, redesign with feedback, evaluate, then observe and reflect on the successes and challenges of its implementation over two semesters.</p>

The scope of the workshop is about how the IS community can play a key role not just to stay competitive and relevant itself, but also in supporting practice with approaching its challenges regarding reskilling and upskilling the workforce. However, to be able to play this key role, the IS community needs to refine the ways we conduct research as well as offer education and training, particularly to professionals. A crucial part of the solution is collaboration between professionals and practitioners. Researchers and practitioners need to find improved collaborative processes to identify problems and develop innovative solutions. Moreover, scholars and practitioners need to improve the ways research and practice can learn from each other and how new knowledge from the IS-field can be disseminated to practice. We recognize the need to move from viewing practitioners as passive information providers to active co-designers in the changing face of IS.

The purpose of this panel is to explore how COVID 19 has impacted digital health and what might be the new normal in keeping with the conference theme of the changing face of IS. Pre-COVID, there was a sense of the need for change given demographic dynamics and technological advances but only little occurred in terms of wide adoption of alternatives as traditional ways of doing things prevailed. During COVID, much of what was initiated was reactive rather than proactive as organizations at all levels struggled to deal with the circumstances. However, much was learned during these trying times to set the stage for sustainable approaches to a new world of digital health extending beyond treatment to a focus on healthy lifestyle engagement and disease prevention. Telehealth, mobile apps and platforms as well as associated application of analytics and artificial intelligence have provided new ways of thinking and opportunities for creativity. Post COVID, organizations and governments as well as healthcare professionals and societal stakeholders now need to evaluate that which has occurred in creating a new normal. The panellists will address pre-per-post COVID digital health issues from their positions of expertise in how COVID has impacted digital health.</p>
